## A Word of Encouragement

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I don't know about you, but there are some weeks that just seem heavier than others. It may just be that it's winter in Ohio, but this week has brought a heaviness in my spirit that's been palpable. Please don't read anything into this, I'm not making some cryptic statement to cause your curiosity to increase and wonder "what's really going on with Lance?" I'm fine, my family is fine, no one is dying, no one has been diagnosed with something terrible, etc. It's just that there are seasons of life, and I think we all go through these, where the heaviness of this life becomes painfully obvious.

Today I'm choosing to remember the rest of John 16:33 "I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world." Jesus spoke these words to His disciples in preparation for His journey to the cross. They were going to experience trouble in way that they could not imagine – even after Jesus spoke plainly about the cross and what was to come. Take heart, Jesus has overcome the world. Perhaps you've walked through a particularly heavy week as well. I want to encourage you to turn to our only hope, Jesus. He will not leave you or abandon you. He's with you in the midst of the most difficult and painful circumstances. Let's cling to Him and not lose hope!
