The work of Project Help also includes a medical clinic and hospital at Pierre Payen as well as a nursing school and physical therapy school near St. Marc. Project Help also enjoys ministry partnerships with the Water Project for Haiti and Homes 4 Haiti.

I had the opportunity to visit several of our churches in Haiti as well as tour the vocational schools near St. Marc along with the clinic and hospital in Pierre Payen. On Sunday morning there was a parade that followed a 2 mile route that started at the Borel compound and circled back around to the Jerusalem Church, our first

congregation in Haiti. The celebration service was packed as many pastors and delegates from across Haiti were in attendance. The celebration was a wonderful time of remembering the past while looking forward to what God is leading the Haitian Conference to take on in their next 50 years.

I was struck by the magnitude of what's been accomplished through the work of Project Help in Haiti. Thousands of lives have been impacted by the ministry of Project Help. Children have received vital education. Countless lives have been saved and restored through the medical work being done at Pierre Payen. Throughout the years, many have been trained vocationally which has led to fuller and more fruitful lives. The deepest spiritual needs of thousands have been



addressed through the hope found only in Jesus Christ. Many people have had their eternal destinies impacted by the grace of God through the faithful ministry of Project Help.
