

Our Great Lakes Regional Conference met on June 4-5 at Winebrenner Seminary. The meetings began Thursday morning with worship led by the Movement Church praise team. They are the newest congregation in the fellowship, having launched last October. Earl Mills, GRC director, came and introduced the theme "Strength for the Journey" and a video interview with Dick Wilkin, the first administrator of the Churches of God, General Conference (CGGC). Other business included a review of minutes, budget approval, and reports from the University of Findlay, CGGC pensions, Otyokwah Camp, the GRC Foundation, and several GRC commissions which concluded the morning session.
