

With a lot of help from area Churches of God, they gathered a group of people at the Bob Hoffman YMCA in Dover. After 12 years of weekend rental at the Y, the church built a multipurpose building in 2002 on Fox Run Road in Dover. Nearly a quarter century from its start the fruit of the decision to trust Jesus and launch a new church is evident. The measure is in transformed lives and gospel impact in the community and globally.
